In accordance with your phone message, and e-mail, I am providing you with the following request for assistance on behalf of the Navajo Nation.


**REQUEST FOR FEDERAL ACTION**

The Navajo Nation ("Requesting Entity") requests assistance from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 9 ("EPA") to conduct a removal action within the Navajo Nation at a site commonly referred to as the Skyline Mine, located within the Oljato Chapter of the Navajo Nation. This action request is contingent upon the selection of a temporary, interim remedy that involves excavation of contaminated materials at the site and disposal of those contaminated materials in a fully containerized, lined and capped cell at or in the immediate vicinity of the site.

By making this Request, the Navajo Nation recognizes that with respect to this removal action EPA, or any other federal agency acting in conjunction with or on behalf of EPA, may use its authority under the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act ("CERCLA"), 42 U.S.C. §9601, et seq., the National Oil and Hazardous Substance Pollution Contingency Plan ("NCP"), 40 C.F.R. Part 300, or any other federal statute, regulation or response program, to respond to and recover costs incurred in response to releases or threats of releases of pollutants and contaminants as deemed necessary in EPA's sole discretion to abate an imminent and substantial endangerment to public health or welfare or the environment at the location stated above. The signatory of this request is authorized to make this request.
