COBB COUNTY METH LAB SMYRNA, GA

This fact sheet is not to be considered a technical document but has been prepared to provide the general public with a better understanding of activities that have been occurring at the Site.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this fact sheet is to give you a brief update of the activities that have been on-going in the community.

HISTORY

In February of 2005, a meth lab was discovered on a property in Smyrna, Georgia. Due to the size and magnitude of this meth lab, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was contacted by officials from Cobb County government about performing an environmental investigation on the soils of the yard of that property.

SITE UPDATE

During the week of March 14th, officials from EPA will be on-site to conduct soil sampling of this property. This sampling and analysis event will be conducted to determine if there is an imminent threat to human health and/or the environment.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

Results should be available within 4 to 6 weeks from the date of this sampling event. Future activities will be determined based on the results.
