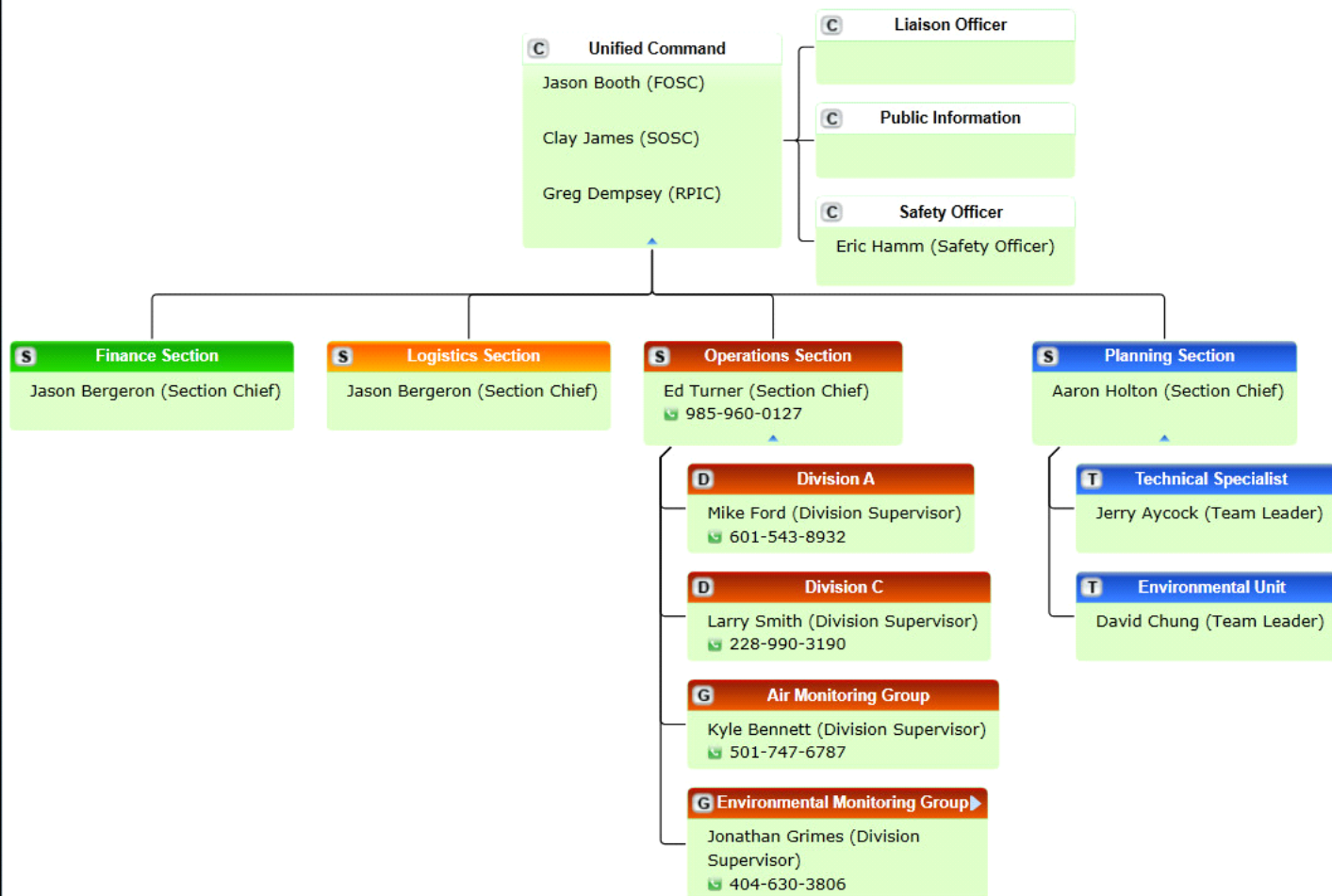

3. Objective(s)			
Ensure the safety of responders and the public. Maintain roadways in close coordination with Shelby County Water Authority to facilitate continued recovery operations. Continue to monitor oil migration pathways and perform any supplemental assessments. Complete the installation and monitor potholes and/or trenches along the streambed areas to evaluate the possibility of additional recovery options, with emphasis at UD7, UD4, and between UD1 and UD2. Finalize the long term containment strategy, ensuring consensus by all involved parties, and begin the mobilization of resources. Continue flushing operations. Continue to fortify and maintain all containment areas. Continue to recover collected liquids from containment areas. Ensure that appropriate erosion controls are in place throughout the site. Keep stakeholders informed of response activities.			
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis (Safety Message, Priorities, Key Decisions/Directions)			
Personnel safety must be stressed for all operations. Ensure close coordination with Shelby County Water Authority and Pelham Water. All response personnel will be courteous and yield to residence near the site, and use extreme caution on the roadways, especially at the railroad crossing. Report total solids and liquids recovered on a daily basis to Unified Command.

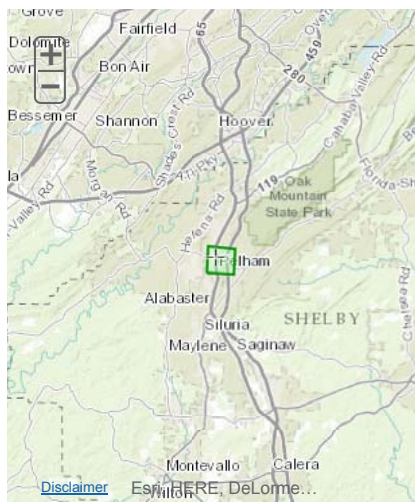

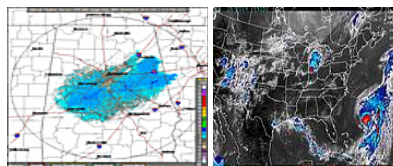
