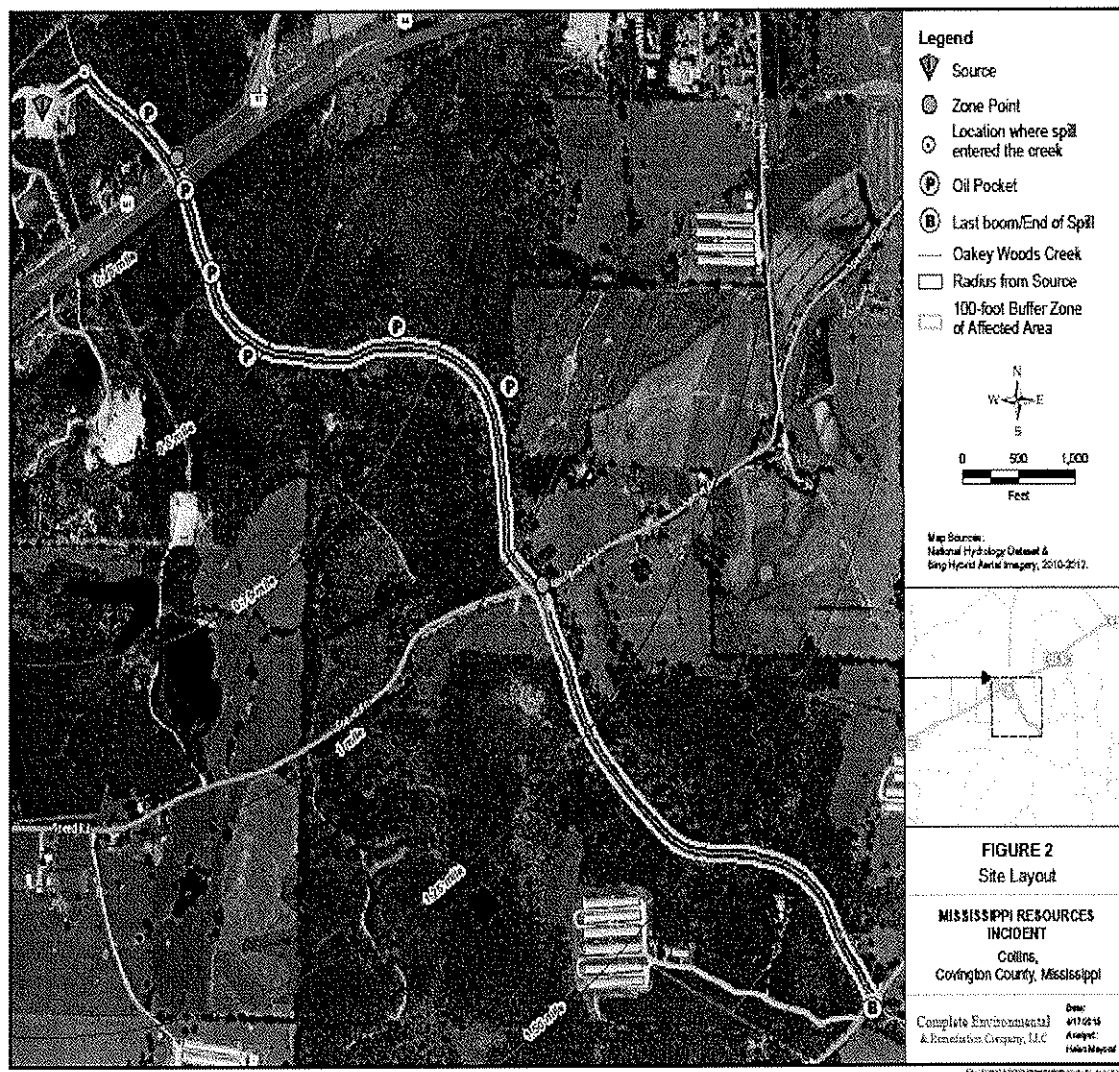

SUMMARY OF CURRENT ACTIONS**April 19, 2015**

On April 16th, 2015, Mississippi Resources, LLC discovered a release of approximately 100 bbls of light crude from the Blackstone #1 in Collins, MS. The spill migrated down a hillside into Oakey Woods Creek for several miles. Migration was accentuated by a 1" rain event. In addition, a nearby resident self evacuated for a few hours due to odor. The source of the spill is contained. The well is currently shut in.

The site is organized as a unified command. Local news coverage has taken place with Covington County EMA providing PIO functions.

MS Resources employed Complete Environmental to lead the cleanup operations and CTEH to conduct air monitoring. MS Resources along with EPA, and MDEQ have agreed upon the following response goals:

- Establish Containment
- Collect all recoverable oil from the impacted area.
- Remove oily debris, including vegetation, as agreed upon.
- Implementation of Waste Management Plan and proper disposal of all collected material.
- Implementation of HASP and preservation of worker safety through an active safety program, and conservation of unaffected environmental resources through best management practices.
- Preparation and Implementation of an Operation and Maintenance Plan to deal with ongoing impacts.

Activities to date have included reconnaissance of Zones A, B, and C; removing recoverable bulk oil from the area using absorbent materials and mechanical means; establishing containment in preparation of rain event; air monitoring

COMPLETE ENVIRONMENTAL**SITE SAFETY MESSAGE**

- PPE: Tyvek, safety boots, safety glasses, hard hat, hearing protection, safety vests. PFD for all boat personnel and those working in or near water
- Watch footing
- Watch out for slips, trips and falls
- Use proper lifting techniques, get help or use lifting equipment
- Keep Hydrated
