Operational Summary

During this operational period the crews focused on containment and recovery of oil from collection points, stormwater control measures, and disposal of impacted materials.

Crews performed maintenance activities in the stream area by placing absorbent pads in areas of visual contamination and replacing boom. Impacted materials were transported to the staging area for transportation and off-site disposal.

All impacted material remaining in the staging area stockpile was transported and disposed off-site. Two poly-lined, 17-cubic yard dump trucks transported four loads of impacted material from the stockpile in the staging area to Pike County Landfill for disposal as non-hazardous solid waste. Two of the loads were pre-loaded during the previous operational period.

Crews performed stormwater control measures in work areas across the site. Riprap, gravel, and overburdened soil previously stockpiled were used for grading and site control. Additional



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stormwater control measures and operation and maintenance activities will resume during the next operational period.
