

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

- IF MORE THAN 3 CARS ON FIRE AND NO LIFE SAFETY THREAT, EVACUATE RESPONDERS AND LET IT BURN.
- IF 3 OR FEWER CARS INVOLVED, DOES FIRE THREATEN POPULATIONS OR CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE?
 - IF SO, FIGHT FIRE USING FOAM AND WATER. REQUEST E911 TO MOBILIZE LOCAL FOAM ASSETS. ADDITIONAL FOAM AVAILABLE FROM STATE WATCH CENTER. UTILIZE HIGH VOLUME DRAFT POINTS IF POSSIBLE.

RESPONSE CONSIDERATIONS

- Prevent migration of spill into waterways if possible. Use earthen berms, plastic sheeting, or other means to block or divert spill movement.
- Waterbodies and canals may be frozen and/or drained in winter months. Snow and ice can limit spill migration.
- Identify wind direction and speed, and notify/evacuate as appropriate.
- If spill reaches waterways, identify any downstream water intakes, and notify operators.
- Identify impacted wildlife and notify DEC Spill Response Hotline.
- Identify impacted historic properties and notify New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (NYSOPRHP) - State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO).
- Flammable liquids become less flammable and have less toxic vapors over time. Do not conduct aggressive response or containment actions if there's no immediate life and safety threat.
- Initial oil booming actions should be conducted in advance of migrating oil, not in contact with oil.
- If propane, vapors are heavier than air and may accumulate in low lying areas. Identify low areas and evacuate, isolate, and/or vent.






RAILROAD MILE MARK A 85 - FAIR HAVEN, RUTLAND COUNTY, VERMONT



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






RAILROAD MILE MARK A 79 - WHITEHALL (EAST), WASHINGTON COUNTY



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
