

<p>DRIVING Practice defensive driving and wear your seat belts. Follow the standard accident prevention formula:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • See the hazard • Understand the defense • Act in time <p>Inspect your vehicle prior to traveling. Ensure that lights, warning, and safety devices are all functional and that the vehicle is current on maintenance (oil level, tire pressure, etc.). Remain alert and aware when operating a motor vehicle. Avoid distractions while driving (cell phone, eating, etc.). Monitor the road and traffic for changing conditions.</p> <p>Light conditions affect driver safety, use car headlights from dusk to dawn, and in inclement weather. Driving in direct sunlight may severely limit road visibility. It is good practice to carry sunglasses in your vehicle and to ensure that the sun visor is functioning properly. Bad weather can affect traction, visibility, and vehicle control. Rain can make road surfaces slippery. High winds make steering difficult and can cause vehicles to veer into the wrong side of the road. Extra caution should be used when driving in inclement weather.</p> <p>Do not use the cruise control of your vehicle during periods of rain or snow. If a vehicle loses traction, the cruise control may cause the vehicle to inappropriately accelerate in an already dangerous situation.</p> <p>All personnel should follow their approved HASP at all times. Use 911 for emergency services when on route, provide location for prompt response.</p> <p>HEAVY MANUAL LIFTING/ MOVING All participants should be cautious when lifting or moving equipment (such as SCBAs). Remember to bend at the knees and lift with your legs to avoid back injuries. Be cautious of rolling, pinching or sharp objects and slip, trip and falls. Individuals involved with the set-up and break down of the exercise venues need to be extremely careful when loading and unloading equipment from vehicles.</p> <p>ANGOLA NATIONAL GUARD ARMORY While at the armory, emergency services can be contacted through: 911 - provide location for prompt response. Paramedic services will be located at the venue.</p> <p>For Severe Weather (i.e. tornado, thunderstorms, lightning, etc.) seek shelter. 
