



7. Work Assignments:
Continue to conduct HHW, high hazard, and asbestos work in their assigned work zones.
Special Teams will continue to conduct tree assessments, address UXO, radiation sources, conduct general air monitoring, high hazard, and asbestos in work zones throughout Butte County and Paradise, CA.
Forward mobile command post is located at 6491 Clark Rd, Paradise, CA.
** Butte Staging Area is located at 2855 Fair Street, Chico, CA 95928

8. Special Instructions:
Resources will be allocated as needed, based on work being performed, and may be augmented between divisions over the course of the operational period.
START leads should be notified of all firearms, munitions greater than 50 caliber and any larger Ordinance (grenades or other). In general these items are to be left in place and START notified so High Hazard Teams with UXO personnel can evaluate. Small arms munitions less than 50 caliber may be picked up by collection teams.
Incident Radio Etiquette. When using a two-way radio, you cannot speak and listen at the same time, as you can with a phone. Perform a radio check to ensure it is in good working condition prior to departing the staging area. Do not respond if you aren't sure if the call is for you. Use general terminology (no codes or abbreviations) when communicating.




