

QUAD AVENUE CHEMICAL AND BIOFUELS SITE

SITE HISTORY

The Quad Avenue Chemical and Biofuels Site is an abandoned industrial facility located in the Pulaski Industrial Area of Baltimore, Maryland. From 1979-2014, several businesses operated on-site, storing and using a variety of chemicals to produce epoxy and biofuels products. The Site consists of two condemned warehouse buildings and a shared loading dock where more than one thousand drums and other containers of unknown contents were abandoned. In 2018, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) determined contamination at the Site posed an immediate threat to public health, welfare and the environment.

EPA RESPONSE CONCLUDED

From November 2019 - March 2020, EPA completed response actions at the site by properly disposing of hazardous substances and contaminated materials. EPA prepared and shipped liquid, sludge and solid waste contained in over 650 drums and 50 large storage containers, and more than 54 tons of sludge, solid waste and other site debris to off-site disposal facilities. In April 2020, following removal of all waste, EPA conducted a geophysical survey of the site property and determined that no underground storage tanks were present. No additional site activities are planned.
