### Tips for gathering your HHW for safe disposal:

- ◆ Seal containers tightly.
- ◆ Bring them in their original containers inside a sturdy box if possible.
- ◆ Do not mix products.
- ◆ Be prepared to leave your containers.
- ◆ Gasoline containers will not be returned.
- ◆ If original container is leaking, transfer the product to a safe container and re-label.
