

CLEANUP PLANNED FOR SHILOH CHURCH ROAD SITE

Shiloh Church Road Site, Nathalie, Halifax County, Virginia

June 2019



Background

- The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is working with a multi-agency team including Halifax County, the Virginia Department of Health, the Virginia Department of Emergency Management and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality to cleanup contamination at the Shiloh Church Road Site.

What is being done to clean up the Site?

- EPA sampled properties in the neighborhood and identified the need for certain cleanup actions in limited areas near the Shiloh Church Road Site.
- EPA will remove and properly dispose of debris and soil that contains hazardous substances from several areas near the Site. For more information about the cleanup, please visit: response.epa.gov/shilohchurchroadsite.

What can you expect?

- Beginning the week of July 15, work will occur in the area where Shiloh Church Road intersects with LP Bailey Memorial Highway.
- Workers will wear protective suits, as seen in the photo to the right.
- Equipment such as small excavators, skid steers, roll off containers and trucks may be seen operating near the Site.
- Additional traffic is expected in the area Monday through Friday due to the trucks and equipment that will be used during the cleanup.



How can I participate?

- EPA sampled many drinking water wells in the neighborhood. If your well was not tested by EPA, and you would like to have a sample collected, please contact Amanda Miles, EPA Community Involvement Coordinator, at 215-814-5557 or miles.amanda@epa.gov.
